The spiritual growth of our members is one of our core purposes. Days of reflection, inspiration, and prayer are offered in various locations in the state. Many Courts start their meetings with the Rosary or other prayers. The National Catholic Daughters often offer retreats. Many local Courts publish prayer lists to their members to share the needs and intentions of others. Some Courts offer Masses for living and deceased members, and local Court members pray a public Rosary at the wake for the deceased. They attend the funeral Mass and offer comfort to the family. Most Courts enjoy the guidance of their own Chaplain.

The Catholic Daughters of the Americas strives to embrace the principles of faith working through love in the promotion of justice, equality, and the advancement of human rights and human dignity for all.



CIRCLE OF LOVE



The image above is symbolic of our CIRCLE OF LOVE program.

By definition, a circle is a curved line with every point equal distance from the point of the center and bound together by the common interest. The seven point program of the CIRCLE OF LOVE is bound together by this common interest - LOVE.

The Cross and Crown in the center of the heart is the national symbol of the Orderthe Catholic Daughters of the Americas. The seven spokes of the circle indicate the needs of the Church and community best served by the Catholic Daughters. The program itemizes these needs with suggestions on how Catholic Daughters can effectively serve. Local courts are asked to select portions of the programs in which their members feel inspired to serve.

EDUCATION

Education is a key component of our Circle of Love which significantly impacts the long-term success of our organization. Education helps bring us to fulfillment, increases our awareness, and helps improve attitudes. An educated member is a more effective member. Education may lead to higher participation in a whole range of activities.

Education programs and activities should help members to learn about CDA, its history, its charitable projects and charities, as well as what the spokes on the Circle of Love entail. This may include topics of a spiritual nature, safety concerns, and medical issues, etc., Education should also be offered about current events, because they affect the needs of our world that CDA must address.

Education Contests and scholarships are offered to both adult members and youth to inspire creative thinking about selected spiritual topics. It is also an opportunity for all to advance their God-given talents. LEGISLATION

CDA members are obligated to become informed on public issues, addressing the moral and human dimensions, while supporting Church teaching on human life, human rights, justice, and peace.

The Catholic Daughters of the Americas DO NOT ENDORSE CANDIDATES OR ANY POLITICAL PARTY!

CDA employs a program called "Operation Morning Star" to encourage and educate Catholic women to speak out in the legislative arena. It's Mission Statement is as follows:

"The Empowerment of Catholic womanhood to develop a Catholic Policy Agenda to reach out and speak out in the legislative arena for the advancement of human rights and human dignity for all, in accordance with the principles of justice and peace."

Why "Operation Morning Star"? One of Holy Mary's titles is "Morning Star". Ven. Fr. Casimir Wyszynski (1700—1755) wrote of her, "Mary is the noble Star rising from the house of Jacob, whose rays illuminate the whole world...let us then watch the rise and movements of this brightest star carefully; let us follow her; let us rise up from the sleep of death by sin....Just as a star once led the three wise men to Jesus as He lay in a stable...so will this Morning Star...lead us to Jesus sitting at the right hand of the Father in the heavenly kingdom."

Quality of Life is directed to the aid and sanctification of individuals and groups, including benefits to those in need. We are called to reach out with compassion and support, to be helping hands where there is pain, poverty, sorrow, and sickness. Quality of Life encompasses the following: Family Life Issues (domestic abuse, human trafficking, drug and alcohol abuse, nursing home activities); Restoration of Family Values (pro-life activities, white ribbons against pornography campaign, teaching children prayers) Family Health Issues (volunteering time to help at a longterm care facility, helping people confined to their homes by running errands or taking them to Mass); Community Issues (Supporting Red Cross, Training in emergency response, helping emigrants); Worldwide Issues (supporting missionaries, Catholic Charities, response to international crises); Protection of Our Earth (recycling programs, education of our members on global warming and conservation, good stewardship); and Health and Wellness (paying attention to our bodies' signals before a health issue gets out of hand, Coronary Heart Disease prevention programs, group walks).

YOUTH/ JCDA

Tomorrow's promise lives in today's youth for they will be the leaders, the citizens, and the church of tomorrow. In responding to their needs today, we shape a better future for all. CDA has made a deep commitment to sponsor, participate in, and support youth activities. This can be accomplished by working collaboratively with existing community and parish youth groups such as the youth ministry, social action groups, local schools, or by sponsoring a Junior CDA Court.

It is the mission of the Youth Program to nurture personal and spiritual growth, to promote service to others, and to foster an awareness and appreciation of diversity through a variety of suggested activities and experiences. Examples range from the simple (becoming a Prayer Partner of a First Communicant or Confirmandi) to hands-on (CDA serving at Taco Tuesdays at the Newman Center on campus, primarily done by Court 2423 Queen of Peace in Omaha). Let your heart lead you where the youth need you.

JCDA

The Catholic Daughters of the Americas started JCDA (Junior Catholic Daughters of the Americas) in 1926 for Catholic girls aged six to 18. Juniorettes are six to ten years old; Juniors are 11 to 18 years old. The program is based on four objectives, or goals:

- To promote the development of the whole person through programs of selfidentity, personal growth, and peer group relationships;
- To promote service to others in the parish, community, and JCDA;
- To encourage spiritual growth by providing opportunities for personal prayer, liturgy, and ecumenical understanding; and,
- To encourage programming that is open, flexible, and creative to and for current needs and concerns.

NATIONAL PROJECTS AND CHARITIES

The Catholic Daughters of the Americas has identified national projects and charities which it endorses and supports. Local Courts support the National Projects (required) and choose National Charities to contribute to (Court's choice).

The FIVE NATIONAL PROJECTS are:

- HABITAT FOR HUMANITY— The Catholic Daughters, in partnership with Habitat for Humanity, work to build affordable, simple, decent homes for economically disadvantaged people so they can have a better environment in which to raise their families. We provide the finances for the house, and in some cases, physically help build the homes. CDA was one of the first women's organizations to complete a house in Habitat for Humanity's seven-day "blitz build". Nebraska CDA women support it in other ways as well, such as feeding the Habitat for Humanity workers, donating materials, etc.
- HOLY CROSS FAMILY MINISTRIES— If you learned "The family that prays together stays together", you may not have known that it is the motto of the Holy Cross Family Ministries. Holy Cross Family Ministries encourages family prayer, especially the Holy Rosary, through the Family Rosary program. Founded by Servant of God Father Patrick Peyton, CSC, Family Rosary seeks not only to fulfill the need to share the message of prayer with those who are unfamiliar with the Rosary but also to strengthen the prayer life of the devout. Since Catholic Daughters of the Americas has the Blessed Mother as our Patroness, and we have a strong devotion to her, we have supported this worthy cause since 1977.
- THE LABOURÉ SOCIETY— The Labouré Society encourages vocations to religious communities. They have financially helped aspirants who wish to enter a religious community but are unable to because of a financial impediment. Donations from CDA help make their vocation become a reality. St. Catherine Labouré is the Patroness of this society.
- SOAR! (SUPPORT OUR AGING RELIGIOUS)— SOAR! was founded in 1986 with \$25,000 seed money received from the Catholic Daughters of the Americas. Augmenting the efforts of the institutional Church, SOAR! is a non-profit organization of people committed to assuring financially stable and personally secure futures for elderly and frail members of Catholic religious congregations.
- NATIONAL CENTER ON SEXUAL EXPLOITATION— In 1962, Morality in Media was established in New York City to combat pornography. In 2015, the name Morality in Media was changed to National Center on Sexual Exploitation. This organization promotes the WRAP Campaign, the White Ribbon against Pornography. The campaign takes place each year at the end of October. An NCOSE newsletter is sent out with each National Quarterly.

NATIONAL PROJECTS AND CHARITIES, CONT.

The NATIONAL CHARITIES are:

- Apostleship of the Sea— In 1920, Port Ministry was conceived. Its goal is to provide spiritual, physical, and psychological services at port locations in the United States to those who work and serve at sea. They are always happy to receive gifts and useful articles to place on board ships in ports at Christmas time.
- Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception— The Catholic Daughters' donations help to maintain our beautiful Basilica in Washington, D.C.
- Catholic Extension— Catholic Extension was founded in 1905 to help Catholics in remote areas lacking church buildings and resources. Its vision is to raise money to help bring the Catholic Church to these isolated communities. Today Catholic Extension serves 87 "mission Dioceses" and funds approximately 2,000 projects annually throughout the United States and its territories. (catholicdaughters.org)
- Catholic Relief Services— This international project was started in 1943 to provide assistance to the people in the poorest parts of the world. CRS reaches out to more than 100 countries with support such as food, medical supplies, and religious assistance.
- Disaster Relief Fund— The Catholic Daughters of the Americas maintains a Disaster Fund to which our members contribute. At the request of the State Regent where a disaster occurs, monetary assistance is forwarded to the Bishop of that Diocese for distribution.
- Human Life International— Human Life International (HLI) is a United States-based Roman Catholic anti-abortion organization. It is one of the largest anti-abortion organizations in the United States. It is also the largest international pro-life organization in the world. It has affiliates and associates in over 116 nations worldwide and has sent representatives to approximately 160 locations. Through their global mission Human Life International is:

- Training local leaders and make a lasting impact on communities around the world through doctors and teachers.

- Helping families choose life by providing counseling, healthcare, and other resources to expectant mothers in crisis.

- Going beyond abortion by bringing Christ's teaching on life and family to the world including chastity, marriage, end of life issues, and more.

Human Life International works to build a pro-life culture.

NATIONAL CHARITIES (CONT.):

- Missionaries of Charity— The Missionaries of Charity Sisters (Mother Teresa's Sisters or the Sisters of Mother Teresa, as many call them) is a religious community in the Catholic Church, founded by Mother Teresa of Calcutta (now St. Teresa of Calcutta) in 1950 in Calcutta, India. The community is totally dedicated to the service of the poorest of the poor, irrespective of social class, creed or color. The Sisters deliberately choose to show God's concern for the poorest and the lowliest, remaining right on the ground, while offering immediate and effective service to those in need until they can find someone who can help them in a better and more lasting way.
- The North American College— At the Pontifical North American College, formation of men for the Priesthood of Jesus Christ is characterized by the four pillars of priestly formation: human, spiritual, intellectual, and academic development. There are about 160 seminarians, as well as numerous faculty members and graduate students from across the United States, Canada, and Australia, who devote themselves to personal formation for priestly ministry under the attentive guidance, supervision, and evaluation of a formation faculty of priests and religious.
- Tutwiler Clinic— The Tutwiler Clinic operates under the direction of Sister-Doctor Anne Brooks. It serves the poorest of the poor in the Bayou country. It runs totally through donations offering medical help to those who do not have the ability to seek or pay for services. The Tutwiler Clinic is always happy to receive medical supplies/samples and over-the-counter medicines as well as clothes. Quilting and sewing supplies are always welcome. They sell quilting items in an attempt to become self-sufficient..
